REMEMBERING

We all have memories that are very significant to us, and we greatly cherish, such as our wedding day or the birth of our children. Even though these special events may have happened quite a long time ago, we retain a very vivid memory of them.

Equally memories from our childhood remain very clear despite the passing of time. Yet, we can struggle to remember significant events that have happened more recently and as we get older, we tend to forget things, such as peoples' names and other important details.

I know as the Vicar of a parish with so many churches and even more village communities, that it is essential I spend time learning people's names, and then try my best not to forget them, as it could be a little while before I see that person. Using a person's name in conversation is a clear sign that we know who they are, as our name helps to give each of us our identity.



November is a month when there is a focus on remembering - the remembrance of our own loved ones, who have died on All Souls Day; and on Remembrance Sunday we gather to remember those who have died in the sacrifice of war and pray for peace. During the Act of Remembrance, the names of all those who are listed on the village war memorial are read out, and whilst these names hold no personal significance for most of us standing there, it is important these people continue to be remembered in this way.

In our own lives we will always remember the people who have had the greatest influence on us, such as our parents and grandparents, even if they are no longer with us. Now that I have become a grandparent, I am keen to tell my grandson something about his family as he grows up and particularly these people who he will never know. This remembering and passing on of family stories to the next generation, along with the things we have learnt from our grandparents and parents is essential for furthering our understanding of life and of one another.

In the same way, as Christians we are called by God to share the stories of Jesus with others, along with our own experience of faith and the love of Jesus for us. We regard the death of Jesus on the cross as the ultimate sacrifice as through his death we can know God's forgiveness, love and new life.

For Christians, the most significant act of remembering is to break bread and share wine as Jesus commanded us to do in remembrance of him, when we share fellowship together.

Hello, and Happy November! Having spent a few months in these updates telling you a bit about *what* we're doing as we start a new church with St. Aidan's, we wanted to take the opportunity with this update to let you know *how* it is going. Here's an update from our Kids, Youth and Families Pastor, Steve Weston:

"We've had an amazing start to our new Sunday gatherings at Bridekirk since we launched in September. We've been joined by lots of families who have come along to explore and get involved in this new church plant. It's been particularly wonderful to welcome so many from across a number of different villages in the Binsey area, as well as those from further afield who have travelled to join us. We've seen big and small families; individuals and couples; old, young, and everything in between.

We're continuing to gather every Sunday afternoon at 3pm for our new service. We start by singing all together, with new songs and some old favourites, before a Bible reading and a short talk. After this, we split into smaller groups; one for children up to 11, another for 11-18's, and smaller groups for adults, to think about what we've heard and to pray. The children often get busy with a craft activity, and this will often act as a reminder of the Bible story we have been thinking about. The young people really enjoy chatting about how the Bible verses link with their lives and spend time praying for one another. The adults take time to share prayer requests and pray together as they prepare for the week ahead. We finish with a closing song and then enjoy refreshments together as we catch up.



Book Review

The Dance Tree by Kiran Milwood-Hargrave

I sort of accidentally stumbled upon this novel whilst searching through and 'tidying up' my Kindle. I don't remember buying it, it just seemed to appear, so after reading the blurb, I thought I'd give it a go...

Although I didn't study history to a high level, and maybe even because of that, I find myself drawn to the historical novel time and time again. It's the human stories that I love not the political and religious facts, but the way those facts of the time impinge and affect the lives of the people alive at the time. It's sometimes tempting to believe that people from times past were different to us: less sensitive, less enlightened, less civilised. Of course this might well be true of some people then as it is of some people now, but actually what you come to realise is that people were then as they are now, that little has really changed and that there's nothing new under the sun.



The events of this novel are so strange in places and so unlikely that I couldn't quite believe it was based on real events. Of course the people, their actions and reactions are totally familiar: they love, they hate, they hurt, but most of all, they live so strongly through this brilliant writing that I found this novel utterly compelling.

The story is based in Strasbourg in 1518. In the midst of a blisteringly hot summer, a lone woman begins to dance in the city square. She dances for days without pause or rest, and when hundreds of other women join her, the men running the city declare a state of emergency and hire musicians to play the Devil out of the mob. Outside the city, pregnant Lisbet lives with her husband and mother-in-law, tending the bees that are the family's livelihood. Though Lisbet is removed from the frenzy of the dancing plague afflicting the city's women, her own quiet life is upended by the arrival of her sister-in-law. Nethe has been away for seven years, serving a penance in the mountains for a crime no one will name.

It is a secret Lisbet is determined to uncover. As the city buckles under the beat of a thousand feet, Lisbet becomes caught in a dangerous web of deceit and clandestine passion. Like the women of Strasbourg, she too, is dancing to a dangerous tune. . . .

This is a tale of superstition, hysteria and passion. The central character makes a huge number of discoveries about the family she has married into. Having married a man she barely knew, she is thrust into the heart of his family at a very young age. Her journey to real adulthood is one of self-discovery as well as the discovery of the failings and foibles of those around her. Lisbet forms strong connections, falls deeply in love and suffers the pains of terrible losses. It is these events that force her to grow up and face the world around her. That world is harsh and judgemental but she must navigate her way through it. When organised religion fails her, Lisbet creates a spirituality of her own and that helps her to cope with most challenging events of her life.

I really enjoyed reading this novel and thoroughly recommend it. The writer is one of immense talent and she manages to convey the time period with incredible skill. The heat of the city burns out of the pages. A great read for the lead into winter...the blazing descriptions of the heat of the summer might just keep you warm!

SPEED LIMITS IN THE PARISH

There are currently no proposals to introduce new 20mph limits in Cumberland. All proposals under consideration are for 30mph or greater. The next review is due in 2026/27. Cumberland Council has recently approved a policy for the assessment and introduction of 20mph limits, however it is not likely that Embleton would be a location where a 20mph limit would be suitable but a speed limit change for reduction to 30mph has been added to the Autumn 2026 speed limit review list.

National Highways are planning to install speed enforcement cameras on the A66 between Cockermouth and Dubwath, dates for this are not known but further information will be shared as and when it is known. Concerns were noted about the implications of this on traffic using the C2064 (if people are trying to avoid the speed cameras when they installed). It was noted that this was to be monitored, and action taken if required.

PARISH MAINTENANCE

The two defective street lights at St Cuthberts Church, Embleton have now been repaired and should now be working.

Plumbland

Our new Reception children have settled in very well being guided and supported by our older pupils.

Our Junior pupils have already enjoyed a trip to the Lakes College, Lilyhall for the React Foundation Annual Science & Engineering Show 2024 with Simon Watt of Science Made Simple. The year's show was about space.

We held our annual Harvest Festival at church this week and it was lovely to be joined by out families and members of our community. The theme was harvest around the world and we learnt how Harvest was celebrated in the USA, Thailand, China, Israel, Indonesia as well as the traditions in the UK. WI

Bassenthwaite WI

At our September meeting members enjoyed an interesting and informative talk by Hayley Slack from 'Renewi'. Renewi is a leading waste to product company that gives new life to used materials and is contracted to Cumberland Council to deal with all our general household waste. When we have recycled what we can in the way of glass bottles, newspaper, card and some plastics then Renewi deal with the rest. Most of us had not appreciated that there is now no landfill in Cumbria. General household waste is now dealt with in two large processing plants, one in the north of the county and one in the south. The rubbish is sorted by machines which separate out the waste - for example separating ferrous metals from other metals, sorting glass and separating different plastics. Whereas the rubbish sorted from general household waste cannot be recycled to its original purpose, for example metal waste back to food cans or plastic waste back to bottles, it can be turned into useful products. Some waste can be turned into high energy fuel for industrial use. Plastics for example can be processed and turned into environmentally friendly seats and board walks. Organic waste can be processed into a range of environmentally friendly fuels, fertilizers and even bio-plastics. Disposing of batteries in household waste can be hazardous. When damaged during transportation or treatment, batteries can ignite causing fires and posing significant safety risks. Hayley has recently won an award for her work on an initiative to encourage correct disposal of batteries. Hayley calculated that the number of batteries not being recycled in Cumbria annually is equal to the weight of 3,650 Herdwick Sheep. Called the Baa-ttery Campaign it is at present aimed at primary school children and encourages them to bring used batteries to school for responsible recycling. Disposable vapes also contain batteries and they are best disposed of in special receptacles that should be legally provided in any shop that sells vapes. The winner of the competition for a recycled item was Grace with handwarmers crafted from the sleeves of an old jumper. The quiz 'places in the Lake District' was won by the team of Isobel, Mary, Ros and Kate. Our November meeting is Members' Night and our Catered Supper. The competition will be an old family photo and our hostesses Irene Harrington and Helen Hunt.

Hence the saying "Tied to mothers apron strings". She was thanked for her fascinating talk




